I am delighted to welcome you to our 2023 Black & Gold Ball. It is wonderful that so many of our valued supporters are joining us, both to raise funds and to celebrate all that we have achieved over this past year. We are grateful for the incredible support provided by businesses and individuals.

At Oasis Community Housing our services are in high demand, and sadly the need is growing.

The latest figures from the Office for National Statistics report a 26 per cent rise in rough sleeping since 2021, which means more than 3,000 people are estimated to be sleeping rough in England on any given night.

At least 271,000 people are recorded as homeless, including 123,000 children. Around one in five adults in England and Wales (10.4 million) has experienced domestic abuse at some stage, since the age of 16.

Statistics like these are a startling reality check and we continue to campaign for a new, innovative approach to tackling homelessness.

Our own research shows the vast majority of people facing homelessness have experienced significant trauma in their lives. So, we are calling on policy makers to lead with a trauma-informed approach to ending homelessness.

We believe that every individual is more precious than gold. And that anyone's life can be transformed, however black things may seem.

Your generosity and engagement, at events such as this Black & Gold Ball, have a huge impact on our fundraising and enable us to change polices and transform lives.

Rather than being unseen and being homeless, I'm now being seen...

After three years of homelessness Davey found Oasis Community Housing's homeless drop-in centre 'Basis' in Gateshead, Davey began his journey to stability and safety after finding Oasis.

"I was in full-time employment and things started to get a little bit iffy with me marriage. I had to find a place of me own and I was still working, but then there was times when I used to get depressed and down."

Davey struggled to cope with the challenges of his relationship breakdown and began using alcohol to cope.

"I went in (to work) on the Monday morning with the smell of alcohol, (and they said) 'I'm sorry, we're gonna have to let you go.' I lost that job in about 2011, and I was coping well because I had support, and come 2013, I lost my son."

After 5 years of trying to deal with trauma and depression, Davey found himself on the streets.

"It was October, 2018 when I actually lost me flat. The first three months of me becoming homeless, me first tent got burnt to the ground and, of course, COVID came in. The nine months during COVID, I was still in me tent."



David came to the drop-in and met key worker Sally. That's when he started to turn things around.

"It was bang straight away, Yes, we can do this, we can do that.' Oasis Community Housing helped me set up direct debits....Plus, I needed to get re-associated with me doctor, to get the bank account and it's transpired that I'm doing well now. They gave us a phone straight away for contacts."

Davey now contributes to the direction of the charity by getting involved with Oasis Community Housing's co-production group.

"I've been entrusted to come to meetings, like the co-production group, and help out and I feel it's making me a better person because it's enhanced my own social circles and making more friends and I'm still doing that now."



"Millions of people have been forced to leave their homes because of the war in Ukraine, and we are proud to be working with Leeds Building Society to offer families a safe, warm home and support network.







Stabbed whilst sleeping rough...

John came to the UK when he was just 11. He joined a local school but struggled to find his place and a community. After he finished school he began working in restaurants, but his mental health took a turn for the worse and John relied on alcohol for solace. Things began to unravel and without a safety net John quickly found himself homeless. Struggling in temporary accommodation and drinking heavily, he began to have frequent suicidal feelings and anxiety which prevented him from applying to the EU settlement scheme.

John's overwhelming struggle with addiction and poor mental health became too much and one night he packed a bag, left his accommodation and began sleeping rough. Days and nights under the elements with strangers passing him by was difficult. And then one night, whilst John was sleeping on a bench the unthinkable happened and John was stabbed in his sleep. Found by a passer-by who thankfully called for an ambulance, John was rushed into hospital to have his wounds treated.

After John had received emergency care the police brought him to the Basis drop-in, where they knew he would be looked after. It's a hub of safety for rough sleepers built through the care and financial support of our business community. John didn't have anywhere else to go. If any of our readers have spent time in hospital they'll know how good it feels to get home, have a shower and put on fresh clothes. That's exactly



John continued to visit the drop-in and in time he was helped to make contact with the embassy about his status in the UK and used money, generously given by Muckle LLP, to get a passport; making his application to the EU settlement scheme easier.

John now volunteers in a kitchen and is supported in our 58:7 Project. He is such a hard-worker and hopes to find employment soon. Thanks to people like you, our wonderful supporters, John found hope again.
